Proposed Rule: Endangered and Threatened Wildlife: 90-Day Finding on a Petition To List Gulf of Alaska Chinook Salmon as Threatened or Endangered Under the Endangered Species Act

The NMFS announces a 90-day finding on a petition to list Gulf of Alaska Chinook salmon as a threatened or endangered species under the ESA and to designate critical habitat concurrent with the listing. The NMFS finds that the petition, viewed in the context of information readily available in our files, presents substantial scientific or commercial information indicating that the petitioned action may be warranted. To ensure that the status review is comprehensive, the NMFS is soliciting scientific and conclusions.' Many Alaska elected commercial information regarding this species from any interested party.

Analysis: NMFS Response to Petition filed in Jan. 2024 by Washington State environmental organization: agency took action although it said the petition 'contained numerous factual errors. omissions, incomplete references, and unsupported assertions and officials denounced the NMFS action, citing opposition to the ESA. claiming this action will furthe harm the fishing industry and highlighting the agency's neggative charactrization of the petition.

Proposed Rule: Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants: Finding for the Gray Wolf in the Northern Rocky Mountains and the Western United States

FWS announces a finding on the gray wolf (Canis lupus) in the Northern Rocky Mountains (NRM) and in the Western United States. After a thorough review of the best available scientific and commercial data, FWS finds that gray wolves within outrage, and was used to argue the NRM area do not, on their own, represent a valid this FWS finding was flawed. An listable entity; therefore, the NRM is not warranted for listing under the ESA. FWS finds that the gray wolf in the Western United States is a valid listable entity; however, the gray wolf in the Western United States does not meet the definition of an endangered species or a threatened species. Thus, FWS finds that listing the gray wolf in the Western United States is not warranted at this time.

In February 2024, in Montana, a man ran over a wolf with a snowmobile, then tortured the animal, showed her off at a bar before she died, for which he received a \$250 fine.
